As we turn the page on 2023, our hearts overflow with gratitude for the blessings that filled our church walls and spilled onto the streets of our community. This past year, we witnessed not just growth in numbers but also the depth of our faith, the strength of our connections, and the impact of our collective spirit.

- Worship attendance soared: Our worship services combined welcomed, on average, 204 individuals each Sunday, a heartwarming increase from 181 in 2022. - Our circle widened: We welcomed 23 new members and one restored member into our fold, strengthening our ranks and enriching our shared experience. Each new face is a blessing, enriching our life together as disciples of Christ.
- Membership blossomed: Our church family grew from 368 to 382, a testament to the vibrant life within our walls. This growth is not just numerical; it reflects the dedication of each member, who contributes their unique gifts to build a stronger, more impactful faith community.

These numbers are not mere statistics; they are stories of lives touched, bonds strengthened, and faith deepened. They are the echoes of laughter in fellowship halls, the quiet reflections during prayers, and the hands reaching out in service to the world.

PRAYER QUILT MINISTRY

The prayer quilt ministry is just starting. We will meet on the second Thursday of the month. We will be meeting in the FLC, on **Thursday, February 8, 2024, from 9:00 to noon.** This month, the way the calendar fell, it is the week prior to the Potluck with a Purpose.

In January we had a good turnout with experienced quilters and those eager to learn. It is a new year and a new activity offering fellowship and creativity. Even if you are unable to sew, we have thread that needs to be sorted and seams need pressing.

We are asking for donations from the congregation. We will be collecting cotton fabric, thread, batting, tools used for sewing (thimbles, threaders, long pins, etc.), or cutting fabric (rotary cutters) in plastic crates near the mission barrels in Harper Hall and the FLC. With the donations we have already received, the fabrics are being paired and prepared to sew.

The lap-size quilts will be sewn at the church and/or at home by the group. The quilts will be prayed over at the end of each session. Recommendations for distribution to recipients will be taken from the Prayer Group, the Grace Notes, and church members recommendations. A quilt may be requested directly from a member of the group for a recipient.

We have several tasks associated with making quilts. Not all of them require being able to sew! We need people able to use a rotary cutter, iron, machine sew (straight stitch), and hand sew (blind hem). All are welcome to stop by at around 11:45 to pray with us for the ones who will be the recipients of these quilts for their healing and comfort.
