The Projects

1. IMPROVE OUR WELCOME: EXPANDED FOYER AND ENTRANCE

We dream of replacing the two aging houses next to the sanctuary with an expanded foyer and welcome center, designed to foster fellowship and connection. This addition will include:

• Larger Foyer (Narthex) with Improved Flow and Visibility

A larger, more open foyer creates a welcoming first impression. It provides much-needed space for fellowship, connection, and hospitality before and after services.

Additional Classrooms Along the Foyer Area for Sunday School and Discipleship Groups

These classrooms will enable us to accommodate growing classes, provide dedicated space for Bible studies and small groups, and create room for new ministries. By creating additional classrooms along the expanded foyer, we can restore the gym to ministry use. This also allows us to finally offer dedicated spaces for our largest Sunday School classes, which are currently meeting in more public areas.

Accessible Restrooms

Updated and accessible restrooms located near the main entrance that are usable by guests, families with children, and individuals with mobility challenges.

Covered Drop Off (Porte Cochere) and Additional Handicap Accessible Parking Near Entrance

Ensures safe and comfortable access to the church in all weather conditions, demonstrating sensitivity to those who face mobility issues.

2. ENHANCE THE SANCTUARY FOR WORSHIP

Our sanctuary has long been the heart of our worship life. We plan to update it so that both our Traditional and Contemporary Encounter services can thrive in one area. This change allows us to invest in technology and enhancements for a single venue, fosters connection between services through a shared foyer, and places the nursery conveniently close for young families. Moving Encounter into the sanctuary will also free the gym for youth, children's, and community activities, something which has been inaccessible to them for several years.

- Extended Chancel (stage) More space for choirs, ensembles, and seasonal music in the Traditional service, while integrating the Encounter band in an orderly, appealing way. Also supports dramas, children's programs, and community gatherings.
- Moveable, Central Pulpit Adaptable for various worship styles, teaching, weddings, funerals, and special events.
- Retractable Shades Preserve the beauty of stained glass for Traditional worship while allowing low-light settings for Encounter, Christmas Eve Candlelight, and Holy Week services.
- New Flooring Replace worn carpet with durable, attractive material that is easier to maintain
- Padded Chairs Greater comfort, flexible seating arrangements, and easier building maintenance. Having moveable chairs allows us to reconfigure our seating for special events and gain easier access to our lighting for repairs.
