FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Over the past several

years, we have witnessed God doing remarkable things at Bullard Methodist Church. From the challenges of COVID-19 to the journey of disaffiliation, our church family has remained steadfast in faith, united in mission, and open to the Spirit's leading. Along the way, we've seen new families join, ministries grow, and lives changed by the grace of Jesus Christ. Clearly, God is at work among us.

Many of you will remember the Tree of Dreams that stood in Harper Hall not long ago. On its branches were hundreds of paper leaves filled with prayers and hopes for the future of our church. Those leaves weren't just wishes on paper—they represented the heart of our congregation, a shared vision for how God might use Bullard Methodist to impact generations to come. Some of those dreams have already taken shape in smaller ways, but many of the "big dreams"—the ones with the potential to reshape how we welcome, disciple, and worship—are still ahead of us.

It's about classrooms where disciples can be formed in Christ. It's about a sanctuary that supports vibrant worship—traditional and contemporary—so that we can reach our community with the good news of Jesus in powerful ways. Our facilities are tools, and when sharpened for God's purposes, they help us better fulfill our calling to make disciples of Jesus Christ in Bullard and beyond.

I know a project of this scale brings with it many questions: What will this mean for our congregation? How will the work unfold? What will it take for these dreams to become reality? The Town Hall will be a place for us to explore those questions openly. We'll share our vision, discuss the opportunities, and invite your input. Just as importantly, we'll commit this process to prayer—asking, "God, what do you want to do through me?"

I want you to know this: no single person, and no small group of us, can carry this vision alone. But together, united in faith and generosity, we can do far more than we could ever imagine. Scripture reminds us that when God's people work with one heart and one purpose, extraordinary things happen.

So mark your calendars and make every effort to be with us on October 12. I believe this gathering will be a turning point—a chance for us to look back years from now and say, "That was the moment when God launched us into something new." Come ready to listen, to dream, to ask questions, and most of all, to seek God's will for our future together.

Let's take this step of faith side by side. The best is yet to come.

PRAYER QUILT MINISTRY

The Prayer Quilt Ministry will now be meeting on the *first* Thursday of the month. In October, this will be on **Thursday**, **October 2**, at 9:00 am, in the FLC. We will pray for the recipients of the quilts at 11:45 a.m.

In 2025, we distributed **80** quilts. Since the ministry began, between February 25, 2024, and September 15, 2025, we have distributed **204** quilts. We reached the 200 quilts distributed just days before our 18 months of distributing quilts. We distribute to those in the military, with health issues, or going through a rough time. We depend on feedback from all of you to know who may be in need of prayers for healing and a quilt for comfort. If you have a close friend or relative who lives out of town, you may request a quilt, and we will give it to you to forward it to its final destination. If you would like a service member to receive a patriotic-themed quilt or an alternative color, please contact us.

Thank you to everyone who contributed sheet protectors to our ministry. We will make good use of them for quite a while to come.




This is a very rewarding ministry. If you feel led to bring a short devotional message just once a year, it would be a great help to us and a blessing to you.
