# "GETTING TO KNOW YOU!"

A new series where we get to know our church staff. We begin with David Thrasher.

## What is your role at Bullard Methodist Church, and what do you love most about it?

Contemporary Worship Leader/Director of Ministry.

### How did God lead you into ministry or to serve in your current role?

God called me at a very young age to serve Him through music ministry, and it's been a joy to walk in that calling for the past 20 years. The last six years here at Bullard Methodist have truly been the most rewarding. That's why, when I sensed the Lord leading me into a deeper level of service to His body here, I felt both humbled and honored to follow His call.

### What's a Scripture verse that has shaped your life or ministry?

Revelation 22 has always been my favorite passage of Scripture. It begins with a vision of a river flowing from the throne of God — a river of goodness and holiness that nourishes the tree of life, whose leaves are for the healing of the nations. I often imagine myself wading into that river, letting God's goodness wash over and restore me as I worship. The next verse says that those who love God will serve Him forever and will always see His face. Those words fill me with hope, because serving the Lord has been the greatest joy of my life. Knowing that this joy of serving Him will continue for eternity — that I will serve Him forever and always see His face — is a beautiful promise that deeply anchors my faith.

## If you could have dinner with any biblical character (besides Jesus), who would it be and why?

I think I'd have to give in to my curiosity and choose Lazarus. I've always wondered what it must have been like for him — to die and leave a world where Jesus was present, to enter heaven where Jesus had not yet returned to, and then to be called back to life by the very voice of Jesus. Then, after walking with Him again, to experience being separated once more when Jesus ascended to the Father, only to die a second time and finally be reunited with Him for eternity. I

can't imagine the depth of perspective and faith Lazarus must have had after living that story.

## What's something people might be surprised to learn about you?

I LOVE westerns.

## When you're not serving at the church, what's your favorite way to spend a day off?

I am very much an introvert, so my favorite way to spend time off is at home. With my family. Watching a movie, reading a book, or playing a video game.

What's your favorite worship song or hymn right now? How He Loves has always been and probably will always be my favorite song to worship along with.

## What's a hidden talent or quirky skill you have that most people don't know about?

I'm a rider — of both horses and motorcycles. I grew up showing horses in western pleasure competitions and endurance races, and later in life I picked up motorcycle riding. I don't get to ride as much these days with a little toddler at home, but it's still something I really enjoy when I can.

## What's your go-to comfort food or favorite local restaurant in Bullard/Tyler?

I feel like this might be a trick question, because every time I find a place I dearly love to eat they close down. So, a safe bet would probably be Bubbas in Tyler. Plenty of great options to choose from, with a friendly staff and quick service.

### What's one thing I hope people experience when they come to Bullard Methodist Church?

I want people to see Jesus. If they leave and haven't seen Him, then we've missed the mark. They should see Him when they look into our eyes, feel His presence in the atmosphere of worship, and hear His voice reflected in our words. They should even sense the sweet fragrance of His grace when they're among us. My greatest hope is that when someone leaves Bullard Methodist and goes back into the world, the one thing they remember is Jesus — everything else should pale in comparison.

### SAGER BROWN MISSION TRIP



We had six people representing Bullard Methodist Church in Baldwin, LA, at the Sager Brown Depot.

We began the morning with a devotion presented by a different person each day.

During the time we were there, Carl Coleman and Paul Donnelly participated in lawn maintenance and equipment repair. I don't know if the equipment repair should count since Paul was the person operating the equipment when it broke, two years in a row.

All six of us worked in the depot on hygiene kit verification or preparing items to be put in the flood buckets by the group following us the next week.

June Coleman, Leah Williams, Margaret Spier, and Judy Donnelly participated in community outreach programs. At the Hope Floats Boutique, a thrift store supporting the local ARC group, we did window dressing and coordinated displays with merchandise from various departments in the store. At Maison Teche Nursing Home, we distributed the prayer quilts we had taken with us to 24 of the residents. Afterwards, we sang hymns.

On our afternoon off, we toured antebellum homes and learned of their history. We discovered the Cajun version of Hondo & Shorty's. In the evenings, we played Rumikub, Mexican Train, and worked puzzles, as well as relaxing by the bayou and eating s'mores.
